Please read this Privacy Notice carefully. If you do not agree with the terms and conditions of this privacy notice, do not access, view, or use any part of this website or use any services provided by Fiedler and Associates, L.L.C.

Fiedler and Associates, L.L.C. is a law firm operating in Marietta, Georgia, United States. At Fiedler and Associates, L.L.C. ("the law firm," "the firm" "us", "we", or "our"), we understand that data privacy and protection are important to you. Following laws, guidelines and best practices, we try to integrate physical, technical, and administrative safeguards to protect your personal information from loss, misuse, unauthorized access, disclosure, alteration, or destruction. Fiedler and Associates, L.L.C. strives to follow best practices and legal requirements for safeguarding personal information of our clients and any personal information you provided in the attorney-client relationship or through this website.

This Privacy Notice describes information we may collect from users ("users" or "you") or that users may provide to us when they visit our website, including the webpages and services delivered through the domain cfiedlerlaw.com, fiedlerassociates.com, attorneycarrie.com, and any other domain used by Fiedler and Associates, L.L.C. (also referred to as "the website," the "site"), and in email or other electronic messages between the users and this website, and in our attorney client relationships with clients, and in our practices for collecting, using, maintaining, protecting and disclosing that information. This Privacy Notice also describes certain rights and choices that you have with regard to your personal information.

In this technological world that we live in today, everyone must take necessary and appropriate precautions for safeguarding passwords, ID numbers, vital records. No Internet transmission is ever totally secure or error-free. If we make material changes to this policy, we will notify you here that it has been updated, so that you are aware of what information we collect, how we use it, and under what circumstances, if any, we use and/or disclose it.

Information Collected

We regularly receive, collect, store and process Personal Information related to carrying out legal services and professional activities. For this Privacy Notice, we define “Personal Information” as any information that, by itself or in combination with other information, identifies, relates to, describes, references, is capable of being associated with, or can reasonably be linked, directly or indirectly, to an individual, an electronic device, or a household. Our law firm collect personal information that may include, but is not limited to, the following: contact information, employment Information, marketing information, technological information, billing and credit card information, special categories of personal information like immigration data, and other data. Please note that personal information may also be subject to ethical duties of confidentiality or privilege.

On the website we may collect personal information, such as your name, postal address, email address, phone number, IP addresses or any other personal or sensitive identifiers only when you have voluntarily provided such personal information to us to answer your inquiries or for other uses like password protected portions of the websites or in conjunction to services requested by you in the attorney-client relationship. We may also use third-party services like payment apps.

Also, web servers and other analytics tools may collect and store the following general information about you: the originating name of the domain from which you access the Internet; the date and time you access the Site; the pages of the websites you visit; your search queries; the Internet address of the website from which you linked directly to us, the Internet Protocol, and the type of device, device ID and web browser you use to access the website. This information is collected automatically. Do Not Track

As web features and cybersecurity laws and standards develop, "Do Not Track" may soon be available to limit what data is collected and compiled about you. Our law firm uses third party applications and browsers that do not currently allow the law firm to limit or restrict the flow of certain types of information.

Automated Decision Making

We do not use your personal information for making any automated decisions regarding legal or other services provided by the law firm nor do we sell any personal information. However, some third-party data collection may result in automated decisions elsewhere outside of the control of the law firm.

Disclosure of Information

At the law firm, we do not knowingly rent or sell your personal information to outside marketers. We may share your information (as described in this Privacy Notice) with its affiliates, subsidiaries, or divisions and with their respective officers, directors, employees, accountants, attorneys, and agents, or business partners. In certain circumstances, we may share data with vendors like credit card processors to help us provide you with the legal or other services that you have requested, to operate websites and other common business

We may also share data with vendors for any other purposes disclosed by us when you provide the information or with your consent. We may be required to information to law enforcement officials and regulatory authorities in accordance with the law or when we otherwise believe in good faith that the law requires it. How Long Do We Keep Your Information?

When such a purpose no longer exists, we will securely destroy your personal information in accordance with applicable law and policies.

of sharing your personal information and take all reasonable measures to secure your personal information from accidental loss or unauthorized access, use, alteration and disclosure. In the event of a security incident that causes an unauthorized data breach or unauthorized access, alteration or disclosure that compromises your personal information, we will notify you and any applicable regulators as required by applicable law.

Updating Your Personal Information

Global and Local Privacy Laws

Around the world, privacy and data protection awareness and legal frameworks are developing. GDPR

The Europe's General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR") provides for certain rights and responsibilities of organizations towards natural people.
